- II. **Public Comment Period** – None.
- III. **Action Items**  
Minutes for June 2024 were deferred to next month as quorum was not met.
- IV. **Informational Items** - San Joaquin Health Centers Street Meds Update for Stanislaus County was present by Joan Singson
  - a. STAN SMO (Stanislaus County Street Medicine Outreach), started in March 2024. Currently have clinics two days a week.
    - Wednesdays, 9:30am-2:30pm: Walking Clinic –Varying Locations
    - Thursdays, 9:30am-2pm – SMO Mobile: Salvation Army/Patient Access Center
  - b. Have had 200 encounters since beginning in March
    - 30% are wound care patients
    - The rest consist of:
      - Bug bites
      - Pain
      - Request check up
      - Request medication refill
    - Doing own enhanced care management services and community health worker visits, to make sure that care is being consistently followed up with.
      - 181 providers
      - 13 Nurse visits
      - 6 MA/CHW assessments
  - c. Health Care Coverage
    - 30 with Health Net
    - 87 with Health Plan of San Joaquin
    - 70 with Other
    - 13 uninsured; helping these people enroll into health care coverage, as no one should be without
  - d. Primary Care Providers
    - Golden Valley Health Centers
    - Livingston Community Health Centers
    - San Joaquin Health Centers
    - Kaiser Permanente
    - Others
  - e. Moby 3 is mobile clinic van that is being used in this outreach. It does contain a restroom and an exam room.

## V. SHA General Membership announcements –

- a. **City of Waterford:** Member expressed her opinion of the recent Supreme Court decision that criminalizes homelessness.
- b. **City of Oakdale:** Announced that Pamela Kelly from Oakdale passed away. She ran the Oakdale Rescue Mission and heavily involved in all things regarding homelessness.
- c. **City of Modesto:** For the month of June, Downtown Streets Team removed about 7000 lbs of trash from city streets and parks. The parks team served 14 city parks throughout the month and continued to build on DTS success. During the physical year of 23/24, the parks team removed 10,733 lbs of trash and removed 790 needles from parks and trails. The Salvation Army Day Center served 391 individuals with drop in services including meals, job training, showers, and laundry services. The Day Center began serving as a cooling center in the month of June and continuing through July. Berberian Center served 301 individuals with emergency shelter services including case management, meals, shower, laundry and housing navigation services. 2 individuals secured permanent housing and 8 individuals were reunited with loved ones with a housing opportunity. SA Safe Park served 17 individuals experiencing homelessness and case management. Currently serving 7 vehicles and 9 individuals. Case management connected 2 individuals to housing and 2 individuals secured permanent housing in June. Modesto Gospel Mission served as a safe sleeping site for 38 women and children. Provided additional services such as showers, laundry, and housing navigation. Beginning in July, starting the 42 unit of bridge housing on 9<sup>th</sup> Street, across from Berberian Center. This will help with the Care Court program. Money is set aside and are in the process of getting contracts.
- d. **County of Modesto:** Excited for the partnership with City of Modesto for the bridge housing project. Continue to work with managed care plans to strengthen systems of care more organizationally and systems level to meet the needs of those experiencing homelessness whether it's to health care behavioral health or other general health needs. Agencies and partners are working together to assure services get rolled out and coordinated.
- e. **SCOE/CSOC:** Stated that there are good things coming out of the Supreme Court's decision regarding homelessness, and to be patient with its outcomes.
